She also presented an overview of the Cervical Cancer screening work the department has been in charge of. Funding for this screening campaign was provided by the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment. The screenings required to use evidence based interventions proposed in The Community Preventative Services and nationally recognized clinical guidelines for cancer screening. The campaign included member engagement materials such as, reminder cards, a dedicated resource webpage, and materials in various languages. The program will continue to be funded through June of 2017. The Population Health department will continue its efforts to increase cancer screening rates.</p>
