Feedback Requested: H.R. 1 Survey

On July 4, 2025, the House Reconciliation bill (H.R.1), previously known as the "H.R.1 One Big Beautiful Bill Act," was signed into law. The bill makes several changes to Medicaid that take effect over the next few years. All states, including Colorado, are required to follow these changes. Update on the Health First Colorado Rendering Provider Oversight Policy

Thank you to everyone who provided feedback on the draft Supervision Policy for Medicaid Billable Behavioral Health Services. Over the past two months, more than 600 stakeholders and advocates shared valuable suggestions, observations, and recommendations.

We've published a <u>Summary of Stakeholder Feedback</u> that outlines the input received. Based on one of the most common recommendations, we're renaming the policy to the **Health First Colorado Rendering Provider Oversight (RPO) Policy** to better reflect its purpose and scope.

Because we received such thoughtful and extensive feedback, we're taking an additional week to ensure the final policy is as comprehensive and clear as possible. We expect to publish the updated RPO Policy in **early November** on the Behavioral Health Policies, Standards, and Billing References webpage.

Benefit Spotlight

M-REACH Implementation Timeline Update

In accordance with House Bill 24-1045, the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing (HCPF) applied for federal authority to offer a limited set of reentry services, creating the Medicaid Reentry and Community Health (M-REACH) program. M-REACH is a new program under Colorado's 1115 "Expanding the Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Continuum of Care" Waiver (1115 Waiver). Implementation dates for the two phases of this program have been adjusted to account for delays in receiving necessary federal authority. Reimbursement for reentry services will begin on the following schedule:

Phase 1 (State-run correctional facilities): January 1, 2026

• Phase 2 (Local correctional facilities): January 1, 2027

FAQs/Clarifications of Coverage and Billing Questions

Regional Accountable Entities to Resume Full Enforcement of Claims Processing Requirements

In order to facilitate timely payments to providers, the RAEs did not enforce all of the requirements to be met before processing claims. This means that some claims were processed even though they may not have adhered to the Medicaid capitated behavioral health program requirements. For example, information used to submit the claim (like specialty type or taxonomy code) did not match provider information in the Medicaid Management Information System (MMIS). To ensure HCPF's full compliance with all federal regulations, these requirements must be enforced. Not doing so could put Colorado's Medicaid federal funding at risk. HCPF is fully committed to following and enforcing all federal and state regulatory requirements.

Clarifying Behavioral Health Secure Transport (BHST)

Behavioral Health Secure Transportation (BHST) is a specialized Medicaid benefit designed exclusively for the safe and secure transport of individuals experiencing a behavioral health crisis. BHST is an unscheduled service available for members experiencing an active behavioral health crisis who need transport to an allowable facility. BHST providers must be enrolled with Health First Colorado, have appropriate licenses and permits, and be contracted with a RAE.

New Drug Testing Unit Limitations and Documentation Requirements for Substance-Specific Confirmatory Tests, HCPCS G0480-G0483:

As of October 10, 2025, the following limits are effective for substance-specific confirmatory tests:

- Healthcare Common Procedure Coding System (HCPCS) codes G0480-G0483 have a unit limit of sixteen (16) per adult member (21+) per state fiscal year (July 1 through June 30).
- Soft limit applies to children, access to additional testing as clinically appropriate with a Prior Authorization.

All documentation, including the order for the drug test, the clinical indication/medical necessity, and the lab results must be maintained in the patient's medical record.

Peer Support Professional Certification Requirements: Timeline and Definition

In June 2025, the <u>Medicaid Sustainability Memo</u> outlining changes to Peer Support was published. The <u>State Medicaid Director letter (SMDL) #07-011</u> indicates that states must determine the minimum training and certification criteria for peer support providers. HCPF is implementing the following policy related to Peer Support Professional certification requirements:

- Effective January 1, 2026, all Peer Support Professionals delivering Medicaid behavioral health services must either be certified or will be certified by July 1, 2026, to be eligible for reimbursement for delivering peer support services.
- Agencies must sign and submit an attestation to their Regional Accountable Entity (RAE) or RAEs by January 1, 2026, indicating that all Peer Support Professionals are either certified or are in the process and will be certified by July 1, 2026.

HCPF follows <u>Behavioral Health Administration (BHA)</u> rule regarding the definitions of training and certification requirements for Peer Support Professionals.

Reminder: Provider Type and Specialty 64/477 ending December 31, 2025

Please be advised that Specialty 477 - Substance Use Disorder - Clinics will no longer be a valid specialty for Provider Type 64 - Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Continuum after **December 31, 2025**. In order to keep Provider Type 64 current and in good standing, a specialty designating a specific American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) level is needed. Refer to the specific specialties on the <u>Find Your Provider Type web page</u>. No further action is needed if your Provider Type 64 enrollment already has a specialty designating an ASAM level. Specialty 477 will be removed from your enrollment automatically after December 31, 2025. Enrollments for Provider Type 64 with no other specialty attached by December 31, 2025, will be terminated.
